

# Shands Stats/Did You Know?

- Last year, UF College of Medicine physicians, Shands nurses and medical staff at Shands Children's Hospital treated 8,465 inpatients.
- UF College of Medicine physicians, Shands nurses and medical staff at Shands Children's Hospital treated patients from every Florida county, 46 other states and eight foreign countries last year.
- The ShandsCair flight team made 198 air transports for pediatrics last year. This includes 163 flights by helicopter and 35 by fixed-wing jet.
- The Shands at UF Burn Center is one of only four burn centers in the state of Florida and one of the two certified pediatric centers in Florida that treat children with second- and third-degree burns.
- The Shands Children's Hospital Neonatal Intensive Care Unit was the first of its kind in Florida. UF College of Medicine physicians, Shands nurses and medical staff within this unit treated almost 900 critically

ill newborns last year. When the unit first opened, infants who weighed three pounds had a 50 percent survival rate, and those weighing two pounds had a 10 percent survival rate. Now, 90 percent of these infants survive.

■ The transplantation programs at Shands include kidney, heart, liver, lung, cornea, pancreas, bone marrow and bone. The first child to receive a transplant at Shands was a 1 year old in 1993 diagnosed with dilated cardiomyopathy.
